## The POST Instructional Methodologies Course

The Train the Trainer course is a 40-hour POST-approved instructional methodologies course that will prepare instructors to develop training and to conduct training in a variety of classroom and/or skills-based settings. This class fulfills the POST rule requirements to teach in a POST approved academy. It is a highly interactive, problem-based class.

Topics for this course include:

- Trainer Liability
- Adult Learning Concepts
- Presentation Skills
- Performance Objective Development
- How to Design Training
- Methodologies to Increase Training Effectiveness
- Appropriate Use of Visual Aids
- Preparation of Professional Lesson Plans

Students should come to the course mentally prepared to work with a small group to use the skills presented in this class to develop and present an original presentation to the other participants. Students will also give several shorter presentations during the week.

The course is pass/fail and includes written assessments and work outside of the classroom. Students should bring a laptop computer on Thursday to use when developing their training materials.

Time does not allow for in-depth tutorials in each of the various forms of presentation media but instructors are available to provide assistance to individual students.
